Chief Officer's Report

It doesn't seem possible that it is once again time to write the annual report. Our working environment is moving at pace and is tougher than ever. We recognise that in order to capitalise on the changes the LPC must not close off any opportunities as you endeavour to create a sustainable business model.

We had to reevaluate our priorities which led to identifying our key stakeholders and from this our revised Strategic Plan grew. Across the entire healthcare landscape, the extra pressures of cuts are being felt. We remain hopeful that this means other healthcare providers are looking at ways to share the load. We continue to promote Community Pharmacy as an appropriate and able partner in joint-working relationships. It might be the case that you are better placed to identify such opportunities than the LPC. If you can help with this, and have strong relationships with your practices and are interested in exploring new ways of working please get in touch with me.

The imposition of the National Contract and its impact has resulted in significant change in pharmacies and new challenges in developing how the LPC would support contractors through these changes. The year has been defined by change with increasing engagement in Quality Payments and the resulting challenges this has presented. None more so than the introduction of Healthy Living Pharmacies and the new roles for staff this has introduced. Also, medicine supply chain issues have resulted in a major impact on the drug tariff margin and has seen significant reduction in income and cash flow problems for a number of pharmacies, the consequences of which are that pharmacies are not replacing staff and spending more and more time chasing supplies.

One of Northamptonshire and Milton Keynes LPC main instruments of communication continues to be the electronic newsletter which grows in popularity. Feedback informs us that for many Area Managers and Contractors it has been the main source of information and reminders. At present, the communication is received by a wide range of stakeholders. This includes not only pharmacies, but Area Managers, Superintendents, CCA Service Managers, Owners and Locums. It has become a reliable source of information and is used by Commissioners to communicate updates on matters that pharmacies need to know about. It is also sent out to all our Members of Parliament.

I would like to end my report by thanking all of the LPC Committee Members (past and present) for their hard work and support.

Treasurer's Report

As a team, your LPC managed to maintain high standards while keeping running costs very low and so managed to keep the levy payable as low as possible. In real terms this meant that between April 2017 and March 2018 the levy collected from contractors in the Northamptonshire and Milton Keynes LPC area amounted to £12000 per month. The 'special levy' collected by PSNC to fund the judicial review is reflected in the increase of £19,382 paid to PSNC between 2017 and 2018. The cost of which was absorbed by the LPC.

We continue to recognise that you welcome support for ongoing training needs associated with Healthy Living Pharmacy and other elements of the Quality Payment structure. We have been grateful for the support received to enable us to do this from Health Education England, CPPE, Milton Keynes Peoples Directorate and Northants County Council. Our strategy has been refreshed to reflect a landscape in a state of constant change. As a consequence we have achieved an adaptable committee better able to use resources and experience to further support you as we enter a new period. The budget designed will enable us to be forward thinking while at the same time ensuring value for money is realised for our contractors and best practice demonstrated.
