Chief Officer Report

AMK shared report (attached)

Update from provided from Fiona Garnett (FG) (BLMK)

An update was shared on Covid vaccinations with 62% being provided from community pharmacy locations. Vaccination site geographies would be reviewed ahead of phase 6 spring booster in 2023 for future unmet need.

Updates were provided on the C19 antiviral supply pilot for high risk patients and SystmOne integration pilot.

FG updated the committee on the appointment of the BLMK community pharmacy ICS lead. The role will support community pharmacy transformation within the ICS with initial focus on CPCS, hypertension case finding and DMS.

FG encouraged CCA pharmacies to ensure they check their NHSmail inboxes for referrals.

FG shared an update on the preconception pilot (slides attached)

TAPR update

CF gave an update to the committee on progress of the TAPR subgroup and the options available.

Any Other Business

RH raised question around backfill cost to attend LPC meeting in light of increasing locum costs. It was agreed there needs to be a fair and consistent approach for all members. AMK took an action to ask other LPCs for their position on backfill costs for increasing locum rates and will report back at next LPC meeting

Reports

Chief Officer's Report November 2022

PharmAlarm. Over 60 devices purchased and hand delivered to pharmacies in Northamptonshire by either AMK, Arti, Olivia or Natalie. also an offer from LPC to reimburse those pharmacies who recently purchased ahead of our offer. We can reimburse £52.

Working to pull together figures for GPCPCS. Danger that service has plateaued . Difficult to encourage surgeries within a PCN to engage if only one or two are active. Non participants drag the IIF (Investment and Impact Fund) score down making it less attractive to take part in this particular area of the Network Contract Directed Enhanced Service.

The indicator fetches 27 points and the performance threshold has been set at 0.65 GP-CPCS referrals per 1000 registered patients per week. The IIF is a points-based scheme. For 2022/23, each PCN can earn a maximum of 989 IIF points and the value of a point will be £200.00

A PCN can earn either all the 27 points or no points for this indicator. This will be based on whether the number of referrals sent to the community pharmacy service meets the indicator performance threshold. To obtain the 27 points, Northamptonshire Rural PCN will need to achieve 1,753 referrals for this financial year.

As of July 2022 (the latest data I could get hold of), Northamptonshire Rural PCN has sent 149 referrals to the community pharmacist consultation service.


In addition to the financial incentive of the service, GP-CPCS also helps to reduce pressure on GP appointments and free up time for GP to concentrate on other matters. The GPreferral service also allows community pharmacists to support general practice by offering clinical advice, sales of over-the-counter medicines and support patients to self-manage their minor illness more effectively.

In order to address this, ICB invested some of their integration fund and have had 2 animations created to help support practices as they try to navigate the service in either Systm1 or Emis. The animations will be shared shortly, they're in the final edit at the moment. Produced by Squimeo.

Band 8 C ICS appointed Community Pharmacy Lead – Milton Keynes Funmi Balogun and Northamptonshire Mini Salteesh. Should be starting January 2023 so that clinical priorities can be progressed. LPC will be invited to meet the new leads as they develop their work plans for short, medium, longer terms.

Sexual Health Services Northamptonshire. Working closely with Lisa Knight-Smith to identify and encourage pharmacies into providing the service. Now have 16 pharmacies interested and at various stages towards going live.

DMS Northampton General will be referring all patients except those who are exempt (patients on no regular medicines on admission and only discharged on short courses, discharge letters that bypassed pharmacy, patients who were admitted <24 hours) from Monday 28th November 2022.
