Nutritional products on prescription update

The following information is intended to provide an update for clinicians on the prescribing of nutritional products and accessing dietetic support.

Adults

- When prescribing an oral nutritional supplement please consider:
- 1. **Altraplen Compact Daily** Is the preferred choice, since it has less packaging (equal to 2 bottles in 1 tetra-pack) and lowest cost. £1.60 for 2 drinks/day
- 2. **Fortisip Compact** For patients that require either one or three per day. £1.65 per bottle
- 3. **Ensure Compact** Is Dietetic led and to be used following discharge from hospital. £3.16 for 2 drinks/day.

Paediatrics

Cow's Milk Protein Allergy (CMPA) - Product choice

When compared to other healthcare systems Northamptonshire has a comparatively high proportion of prescribing for Amino Acid (AA) products. To support improvements:

- Extensively Hydrolysed formula (EHF) e.g. Aptamil Pepti 1 (under 6 months) or Aptamil Pepti 2 (over 6 months) should be prescribed first line. AA products should only be prescribed first line and in most situations on advice of the paediatrician or specialist paediatric dietitian, refer to formulary (link)
- When food is being introduced the quantity of product should be reduced and discontinued after 1 year of age or per guidance from specialist.
- o Make a note on the repeat prescription on date to end and review with parents.
- Home re-introduction is the gold standard to confirm diagnosis in mild to moderate cases.
- o When initiating provide parents with the "What to expect leaflet" on the GP Portal (link)

> Care homes
