Pharmacy Stakeholder group produces Patient Safety Professional Standards

Community Pharmacy England and others have contributed to the Royal Pharmaceutical Society's (RPS) revised professional standards for responding to patient safety incidents.

The Patient Safety Professional Standards: Responding to Patient Safety Incidents has been developed by the RPS, Association of Pharmacy Technicians UK and Pharmacy Forum NI, with the support of a steering group and a public consultation.

Pharmacy First: Recognition of tick bites and the symptoms of Lyme disease.

As we move into Spring, pharmacy teams may start to see people presenting with tick bites and potentially symptoms of Lyme disease.

While tick bites/Lyme disease is not treatable under the Pharmacy First clinical pathway for infected insect bites, with patients needing to be signposted onwards, patients may present with a tick bite with an erythema migrans (EM) rash – also known as a bullseye rash. Therefore understanding more about the signs and symptoms should help pharmacy teams recognise the symptoms and allow them to signpost patients as appropriate.

<u>Lyme Disease UK</u> is holding their annual Wake Up to Lyme monthly campaign in May to raise awareness of the importance of tick bite prevention and what to do if bitten by a tick.

Expand and raise awareness of Pharmacy First, says Healthwatch England.

A new report from Healthwatch England finds that the public is receptive to Pharmacy First but more needs to be done to increase awareness of and further develop pharmacy services.

Telephone scam claiming to be a local pharmacy.

We have been made aware of an incident earlier this week, in which an elderly patient received a phone call purporting to be from their pharmacy, with the caller saying that the patient was owed some medication which would be delivered to them if they supplied their bank details. Thankfully the patient concerned did not supply any confidential information and called their actual pharmacy to let them know.

We understand that it is difficult to contact all patients to make them aware of this scam, but please be aware that this could happen to one of your patients and that they need to be vigilant.

The British and Irish Hypertension Society will be delivering a face-to-face hypertension training to Pharmacy teams. Reminders

Pharmacy First Clinical Pathways Consultations.

A reminder that from **1 May 2024**, as part of the monthly £1000 claim, the minimum number of clinical pathways consultations will be **10**. Only clinical pathway consultations that cross the gateway point and reach an outcome set out in the pathway (without onward referral to another pharmacy), will count towards meeting the monthly minimum number of consultations for the block payment.

Briefing Event: Critical Pressures and the future.

Community Pharmacy England has opened registration for a national event for pharmacy owners as part of an ongoing effort to engage more meaningfully with everyone in the sector. The purpose of the event will be to provide an update across a range of issues impacting pharmacies as well as the wider outlook for community pharmacy and upcoming work.
