# <u>GPhC consultation on standards for the initial education and training of pharmacy</u> technicians

The General Pharmaceutical Council's (GPhC) consultation on standards for the initial education and training of pharmacy technicians (IETPT) is open until 24 December 2025. It seeks to gather views on proposed draft standards which bring about changes to pharmacy technician initial education and training, such as the level of study, entry requirements, educational supervision requirements, and the learning outcomes. ## **National News/Reminders**

### NHS prescription charges frozen for the second-year running.

The Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) has announced that the NHS prescription charge will remain at £9.90 per prescription item for 2026/27.

### Ministry of Defence (MOD) using paper FP10 prescriptions.

The Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) has <u>announced</u> that from the start of 2026, the Ministry of Defence (MOD) will start using **paper FP10 prescription forms** for all outsourced prescriptions issued by MOD medical facilities. Any MOD-issued paper FP10 prescriptions should be processed by pharmacy teams in the usual way.

### Advance Payments Update: Payments now include Flu and Covid-19 activity.

From this month, advance service payments now include the consultation fees for Flu (adult), Covid-19 and Emergency Contraception (part of the Pharmacy Contraception Service).

### Funding & Reimbursement Shorts: Referred back items.

As part of Community Pharmacy England's (CPE) <u>Funding & Reimbursement Shorts</u> series, CPE's in-house Drug Tariff and funding experts have created a new video on **referred back (or unpaid) items.** 

### Pharmacy First: ESPAUR report provides insight into antimicrobial supply from pharmacies.

The UK Health Security Agency has published the English surveillance programme for antimicrobial utilisation and resistance (ESPAUR) report for 2024/25. They have also launched a Keep Antibiotics Working campaign to coincide with World AMR Awareness Week (WAAW) <a href="https://doi.org/10.1007/journal.org/">DHSC Campaign Resource Centre website</a>.

### PQS: Research published on the use of TYI RTI leaflets.

An article has been published in the journal JAC – Antimicrobial Resistance highlighting outcomes of the 2022/23 and 2023/24 antimicrobial stewardship (AMS) quality criterion of the Pharmacy Quality Scheme (PQS).
