Dalivit® supply problems

Dalivit® Oral Drops are out of stock until further notice. Prescribers should review existing patients to check Dalivit® Oral Drops are still required. Where appropriate prescribe **Abidec® Multivitamin Drops** for young children. Ensure the patient is not intolerant to any of the excipients, including arachis oil (peanut oil), which should not be taken by patients with peanut or soya allergy. Counsel parent(s)/carers on the appropriate dose and volume required. Please note, only Abidec® Multivitamin Drops should be prescribed. Other Abidec products are available OTC and are not dose equivalent. If Abidec® drops are not suitable, refer to NPPG table to guide selection of an alternative liquid supplement for paediatric patients. See SPS Medicines Supply Tool for more details.

> Removal of prescribing restrictions on flu antivirals

Prescribing regulations and the Selected List Scheme in Part XVIIIB of the October 2025 Drug Tariff have now been amended to remove the notification requirement in relation to the prescribing of oseltamivir and zanamivir, allowing year-round prescribing of these treatments for patients in clinical at-risk groups as well as those at risk of severe illness and/or complications from flu if not treated.
